TRANSPORT REGULATIONS FOR THE TRAIN TO/FROM ENERGYLANDIA FAMILY AMUSEMENT PARK

- 1. These regulations pertain to non-commercial road transport of persons conducted by the Entrepreneur as an auxiliary service to their business activities at Western Camp Resort in Zator ("Western Camp").
- 2. The purpose of the transport is to provide free transportation of persons to/from the Energylandia Family Amusement Park for the Entrepreneur's own needs. This is not part of the Entrepreneur's commercial business related to tourism services.
- 3. The journey starts from a designated location to the Amusement Park or from the Amusement Park to a designated location.
- 4. The train's operating hours are irregular—depending on the Entrepreneur's needs. The Entrepreneur may provide approximate operating hours for a given day, but departures may occur earlier or later as needed.
- 5. The Entrepreneur is: Western Camp, a company under the name MG Goczał Spółka z ograniczoną odpowiedzialnością, headquartered in Zator, address: ul. Oświęcimska 35, 32-640 Zator, registered in the Register of Entrepreneurs by the District Court for Kraków-Śródmieście in Kraków, 12th Commercial Division of the National Court Register under the number KRS: 0000970405, NIP: 5492467107, REGON: 521948419.
- 6. Persons using the train are required to:

a) Supervise their own belongings;

b) Ensure safety during the journey;

c) Behave in a manner that is not disruptive to others;

d) Adhere to generally applicable laws and the instructions of the driver or the Entrepreneur's employee;

e) Avoid actions that could endanger the Entrepreneur's property or the life/health of others;

f) Follow the instructions depicted on the pictograms in the train.

7. The following are prohibited:

a) Smoking (including e-cigarettes);

b) Consuming alcohol or any other psychoactive substances;

c) Entering the train with roller skates, rollerblades, etc.; with a bicycle or scooter;

d) Bringing or possessing weapons or other dangerous items, explosives, pyrotechnics, flammable materials, drugs, intoxicants, psychotropic substances, so-called "legal highs," or other items that could pose a threat to life or health;

e) Damaging the train, including, but not limited to, affixing stickers or painting;

f) Bringing animals, except for an assistance dog accompanying a disabled person (i.e., a guide dog for a blind or visually impaired person; an assistance dog for a person with mobility impairments; a signal dog for a deaf or hearing-impaired person; a seizure-alert dog for conditions such as epilepsy or heart disease, as stipulated in Article 20a of the Act on Vocational and Social Rehabilitation and Employment of Disabled Persons);

g) Leaning out during the ride; h) Exiting the train while it is in motion.

- 8. Children under 13 years of age must be under the constant supervision of a person responsible for their care.
- 9. Persons posing a threat to safety or order, including those who are intoxicated, under the influence of drugs, psychotropic substances, or other intoxicants, behaving aggressively, or possessing items listed in point 7 of these regulations, will not be allowed to board the train.
- 10. The Entrepreneur is not obligated to organize substitute transportation.
- 11. Complaints will be resolved within 30 days from the time they are received by the Entrepreneur.
- 12. In matters not regulated by these regulations, generally applicable laws shall apply.
- 13. Persons using the train are required to comply with the above rules.
- 14. These regulations are effective as of August 1, 2024.
