

Information Clause Regarding Video Surveillance

Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation; GDPR), in connection with the services provided by: **MG GOCZAŁ SPÓŁKA Z OGRANICZONĄ ODPOWIEDZIALNOŚCIĄ**, with its registered office in Zator, address: ul. Data Controller	The controller of personal data within the meaning of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 (hereinafter referred to as the “GDPR”) is MG GOCZAŁ SPÓŁKA Z OGRANICZONĄ ODPOWIEDZIALNOŚCIĄ , with its registered office in Zator, address: ul. Oświęcimska 35, 32-640 Zator, registered in the Register of Entrepreneurs by the District Court for Kraków-Śródmieście in Kraków, XII Commercial Division of the National Court Register under number KRS: 0000970405, NIP: 5492467107, REGON: 521948419, share capital: PLN 100,000.00 (hereinafter referred to as the “Controller”).

Purposes of Data Processing and Legal Basis	Personal data will be processed on the basis of Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR for the purposes of: a) ensuring the safety of the Controller’s employees; b) ensuring the safety of all persons present on the premises of the Western Camp facility; c) protection of the Controller’s property and ensuring the security of common areas.
Areas Covered by Video Surveillance	Reception, parking area, Bonanza Restaurant, Colorado Restaurant, and common areas of the facility.
Video Surveillance Data Retention Period	All data recorded by video surveillance cameras are stored and available for a maximum period of up to 14 days from the date of recording. After this period, the data are permanently deleted, except in situations where recordings have been secured in accordance with separate legal provisions. Only image (without sound) is recorded and stored. In cases where image recordings constitute evidence in proceedings conducted under applicable law, or when the Controller has been informed that they may constitute evidence in proceedings, the above-mentioned retention period is extended until the final conclusion of such proceedings.
Scope of Surveillance Data	Video surveillance data include: a) the date and time of the recorded event; b) the image of persons whose specific behaviour has been recorded.
Categories of Data Recipients	Recipients of the data may include the Controller and entities involved in the provision of services with appropriate authorisation, including IT solution providers, technical service providers, accounting services, legal services, as well as entities to which the Controller is legally obliged to disclose the data. Personal data may also be transferred to entities processing personal data on behalf of the Controller based on a data processing agreement.
Rights Related to Personal Data Processing	A person whose personal data are processed has the right to: a) obtain information about the existence of video surveillance; b) access their personal data; c) request rectification of information concerning the processing of personal data;

	<p>d) request deletion of personal data on the basis of applicable legal provisions;</p> <p>e) object to the processing;</p> <p>f) request restriction of the processing of personal data;</p> <p>g) data portability;</p> <p>h) the right of access may be limited in justified cases such as the protection of personal data of other persons covered by the surveillance system or the pursuit of claims and proceedings conducted by authorities authorised by law.</p>
Filing a Complaint	A person whose personal data are processed has the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority responsible for personal data protection, i.e. the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (UODO) .
Consent to Data Processing	Providing data is voluntary, but necessary in order to remain within areas covered by video surveillance.
Profiling	The data will not be subject to profiling.
Transfer of Data to Third Countries	The data will not be transferred to third countries.
Request for Securing a Recording	<p>A request to secure a recording should include:</p> <p>a) applicant's details;</p> <p>b) the date, place, and approximate time of the event to which the request relates;</p> <p>c) description of the event;</p> <p>d) justification of the request, particularly indicating the purpose of using the recording, the type of proceedings in which the recording may constitute evidence, and the approximate time when such proceedings will be initiated.</p>
Who May Receive the Recording?	Secured recordings may be disclosed only to entities and authorities authorised to receive and process such data under applicable law.
Supervision of the Monitoring System	The monitoring system of the Western Camp facility is supervised by the Controller or a person authorised by the Controller.
Periodic Verification of Recordings	The Controller or an authorised person conducts periodic verification, not less than once per year , of the legality and purposefulness of the use of the video surveillance system within the facility.
